
PMC's Clarifications for Foreign Medical Graduates


Commission (PMC)
has announced a
clarification for foreign medical graduates
regarding the issuance of their licenses.
"A person, having obtained an undergraduate medical or dental qualification
issued by a university in Pakistan or an
undergraduate medical or dental
qualification issued by a foreign
institution duly recognised by the
commission shall be granted a provisional


license to undertake his house job within fourteen days of verification of their qualification by the granting institution," the PMC said in a statement.

The PMC said that a person who has been granted a provisional license should complete the mandatory requirement of passing the National Licensing Exam (NLE) at any time before the issuance of a full license. It said: "If they (foreign medical students) complete their house job, their provisional license will expire and they will be required to take the NLE to obtain a Full License. "The Good Standing Certificate has nothing to do with NLE. It will only be issued if they have a valid license issued by the commission to practice medicine in Pakistan.

"The only exemption from NLE is under Section 20(3), wherein it allows a full license to be issued to a practitioner who is licensed to practice in a foreign country and has acquired a recognized postgraduate qualification."







SHCC Mandated to **Regulate Quality of Healthcare Services**



The Sindh Health Care Commission (SHCC) established under the Sindh Health Care Commission Act, 2013, has been mandated to improve and regulate the quality of healthcare services and ban quackery in the province

of Sindh in all its forms and manifestation.

In a handout, it notified to all healthcare establishments (HCEs) that compliance to the Sindh Injured Persons Compulsory Medical Treatment (Amal Umer Act-2019) is compulsory for all HCEs, especially the Clause 3(1)(2)(3).

In case if SHCC receives complaint of aggrieved person against any healthcare establishment strict action will be taken against such HCE, it said.

Q) What's the most challenging aspect about your


The sole proponent & champion of non-extraction orthodontics in Pakistan. It always boosts me up.


Q) Who is your favorite teacher?



FDI Global Periodontal Health Project Releases NEW Digital Disease Profile Assessment Tool



This new online tool is a disease scoring assessment that can help categorize an individual patient's periodontal disease profile as either mild, moderate or severe. Based on an observation of the patient, oral health professionals score each item in the questionnaire and calculate the total score of the patient's overall disease profile. This assessment tool aligns with the 2018 classification scheme for periodontal and periimplant diseases and the S3 Level Clinical Practice Guideline for the treatment of Stage I-III periodontitis, recently released by the European Federation of Periodontology. I want to congratulate the team on the Global Periodontal Health Project Task Team:

Thanks to your hard work, expertise, and dedication, oral health professionals around the world will be able to keep their



patients in good health and better diagnose, treat, and manage periodontal diseases.

I am proud of all of you and your effective engagement for oral health and general health.

Remembering Professor Roy Duckworth CBE, FDI honorary member and former editor of the International Dental Journal Roy died peacefully on 16 September 2020, aged 91. He is survived and missed by his beloved wife Marjorie, sons Michael and Stephen, daughter Anne, nine grandsons, former colleagues at the Royal London Hospital, and friends worldwide. Roy Duckworth qualified in both dentistry and medicine at the University of Liverpool, subsequently gaining several higher qualifications. After service in the RAF Dental.

Branch, he moved to London in 1959 as a Nuffield Fellow to work at the Royal Postgraduate Medical School and Guy's Hospital Dental School. He joined the staff of the London (now Royal London), Whitechapel in 1961 and remained there for the rest of his very distinguished career. Roy made rapid progress through the academic ranks, becoming Professor and Head of the Department of Oral Medicine and Periodontology in 1968. In 1969, he took over the mantle of the Dean of Dental Studies from Geoffrey Slack and carried out those duties with great distinction for six years. From 1986-94, Professor Duckworth was Dean of the Medical College at a time of great change when a clear mind and steady hand at the helm were essential.

Outside The London, Roy made many significant contributions to the profession. He was elected Dean of the Faculty of Dental Surgery of the Royal College of Surgeons in 1983, and also held office at various times as President of the British Society of Periodontology,

the British Society of Oral Medicine, and the British Dental Association in 1990. He served on numerous important committees and advisory bodies, both nationally and internationally, and was Editor of the International Dental Journal for many years. Professor Duckworth's outstanding contributions were very deservedly recognized by the award of the CBE in 1987. It was highly appropriate for Roy to be one of the first recipients of the Geoffrey Layton Slack Medal, since he was a patient of Geoffrey prior to taking up dentistry as a career. For those who have had the privilege of working with Roy Duckworth over the years, he remained above all a good friend and a respected colleague.

Covid-19: WHO Convenes Fifth Meeting of Emergency Committee



The fifth meeting of the Emergency Committee convened by the WHO Director-General under the International Health Regulations (IHR) (2005) regarding the coronavirus disease (Covid-19) took place on 29 October. Proceedings of the meeting: Members and advisors of the Emergency Committee were convened by videoconference. The Director-General welcomed the Committee, highlighted global advances and challenges in addressing the Covid-19 pandemic, and expressed his appreciation to the Committee for their continued support and advice. Representatives of the legal department and the Department of Compliance, Risk Management, and Ethics (CRE) briefed the members on their roles and responsibilities. The Ethics Officer from CRE provided the Members and Advisers with an overview of the WHO Declaration of Interest process. The Members and Advisers were made aware of their individual responsibility to disclose to WHO, in a timely manner, any interests of a personal, professional, financial, intellectual or commercial nature that may give rise to a perceived or direct conflict of interest. They were additionally reminded of their duty to maintain the confidentiality of the meeting discussions and the work of the committee. Each member who was present was surveyed and no conflicts of interest were identified. The Secretariat turned the meeting over to the Chair, Professor Didier Houssin. Professor Houssin also welcomed the Committee and reviewed the objectives and agenda of the meeting. The WHO Assistant Directors-General for Emergency Response and for Emergency

Preparedness and International Health Regulations provided an overview of the current context and an update on the implementation of the 1 August 2020 Temporary Recommendation. WHO continues to assess the global risk level of the Covid-19 pandemic as very high. The Committee expressed strong appreciation for WHO's leadership and activities throughout the global response. In particular, the Committee appreciated WHO's critical role in developing evidence-based guidance and recommendations; providing countries with technical assistance and operational support; communicating clear information and addressing misinformation; and convening the Solidarity Trials and the Access to Covid-19 Tools (ACT) Accelerator. The Committee commended WHO's sustained efforts to strengthen national, regional, and global responses to the Covid-19 pandemic. After ensuing discussion, the Committee unanimously agreed that the pandemic still constitutes an extraordinary event, a public health risk to other States through international spread, and continues to require a coordinated international response. As such, the Committee considered the Covid-19 pandemic to remain a public health emergency of international concern and offered advice to the Director-General. The Director-General determined that the Covid-19 pandemic continues to constitute a PHEIC. He accepted the advice of the Committee to WHO and issued the Committee's advice to States Parties as Temporary Recommendations under the IHR (2005). The Emergency Committee will be reconvened within three months, at the discretion of the Director-General. 


